- Learn and Understand by** Reading the TRC's report, *What We Have Learned: Principles of Truth and Reconciliation*.
- Explore by** Learning about *Bill B-15, An Act respecting the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples*.
- Recognize by** Honouring human rights' leaders like Grand Chief Wilton Littlechild and his contributions to the United Nations.
- Take action by** Staying up-to-date on the progress of Canada's national action plan on achieving the objectives of the Declaration and keep pressure on various levels of government to adopt the Declaration.
- Teach by** Sharing the video, *Canada, the Churches, and Bill C-15: Chief Wilton Littlechild* with others.

Explore: Learn about *Bill B-15, An Act respecting the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples* (<https://parl.ca/DocumentViewer/en/43-2/bill/C-15/royal-assent>). This Act is to affirm the Declaration as a universal international human rights instrument and provide a framework for its implementation.

Recognize: Honouring leaders like Grand Chief Wilton Littlechild who has worked for decades towards the recognition of Indigenous rights with contributions to the UN Human Rights Council, the UN Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues, and UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JCUscPpVokl>).

Take action:

1. Stay up-to-date on the progress of the national action plan to achieve the objectives of the Declaration; and
2. Keep the pressure on federal, provincial, territorial, and municipal governments to fully adopt and implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.
